Headache Excellence Tournament

We are happy to announce that the sixth annual Headache Excellence Tournament will be held during the Migraine Trust International Symposium in London this September.

The tournament is designed to give talented young scientists a platform to present their data during a short talk and discussion, and to benefit not only from sharing their research expertise, but also from improving their communication skills and expand their knowledge in the headache field. All presenters are selected in a blinded fashion (both names and institutions) based on the content of their submitted abstract. Of the six

presenters, two winners are selected by the audience: one for a clinical research presentation and one for basic research.

New bylaws and committee membership terms

Inspired by feedback from IHS Junior Delegates during our open meeting at the International Headache Congress in Vancouver, we have decided to make some changes to the bylaws and committee membership terms of the IHS Trainees and Residents SIG to increase awareness and to give IHS Junior members more influence on our activities.

As a consequence, starting from next year, the Trainees and Residents SIG will have a General Meeting during the International Headache Congresses, which will be open to all Junior IHS members.

In addition, members of the Trainees and Residents SIG will be elected by the IHS Junior membership.

Six members are elected to 2-year terms of office by the membership during the General Meeting of the Trainees and Residents SIG, automatically renewable for a second 2-year term. Voting will be carried out through an internet-based voting system. Members may serve for a maximum of 4 years.
