Annual Report on Asian Regional Consortium for Headache (ARCH) in 2022

1. Current Status of the ARCH

The mission and vision of the ARCH are to advance headache science, education, and management in the Asian by: 1) Raising awareness of headache in Asia; 2) Creation of a platform to foster headache specialists and exchange their expertise in Asia; and 3) Enhancement of the partnership and collaboration with the IHS.

The ARCH covers the Asian and Oceanian population which is estimated to be over 4.9 billion. The ARCH is now composed of 17 national headache societies (12 in 2016). They include: Australia, China, India, Japan, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Nepal, New Zealand, the Philippines, Singapore, South Korea, Taiwan, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Indonesia, Pakistan and Thailand. We plan to set up headache societies across entire Asia covering all 62 countries in the future.

2. The ARCH Activities

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




Figure 2. The first ARCH logo.

The ARCH has just opened an internet-based communication platform or the official ARCH homepage (Figure 1) with its first logo (Figure 2). Several mobile Apps are in development to connect our 1,500 members together, easily.



Once our name was the Asian Regional Committee of Headache, which was attractive and has been well represented us. Nevertheless, we have changed the name of our society to make our society into a better organized group since 2017.




Figure 4 from the new ARCH website




5. Headache Update in Sri Lanka.
